In his book, Free to Live, John Eldredge writes about "the utter relief of holiness." I have not really thought of holiness offering a sense of relief, but I am beginning to do so more and more. We usually think of holiness as something we are to be, something we strive for, work towards. Scripture tells us that God is holy and those who worship him must be holy. It seems to have an air of requirement and obligation. And yet, it is God who makes us holy (Leviticus 21:8; Exodus 19:6), and we participate in this by choosing it daily (1 Peter 1:15-16).

In scripture, when people feared coming before the Lord (Ex. 19-20), they did so because they feared the intense holiness of God that was described as a consuming fire (Heb. 12:28-29), that convicted them of sin and unrighteousness. Yet, it was to this fire that God was purposely drawing them, so they could be free to live the life for which they were intended, a holy life. Holiness is really all about God's pure love that defines all that God is and does.

To come then, into the holiness of God is ultimately about being unburdened from all that would keep us bound and be set free. Is this not the hope of the Christian life, that there is a way to be good again? John Eldredge writes, "The hope of Christianity is that we get to live life like Jesus. That beautiful goodness can be ours. He can heal what has gone wrong deep inside each of us. The way he does this is to give us his goodness; impart it to us, almost like a blood transfusion or mouth-tomouth resuscitation. We get to live his life—that is, live each day by the power of his life within us. That's the hope: you get to live that life."

To this I have to say, "wow!" We get to live the life of Jesus himself! How cool is that? Yet, that is the hope of the Christian life, whether we have realized it or not, it is ours in Jesus Christ. In the offering of Christ upon the cross, we have been sanctified or declared holy (Heb. 10:10). Now Jesus is engaging us in a process of literally making us holy (Heb. 10:14). We call it discipleship. In it we learn what it means for his life to be lived out through as we learn from him and surrender our will to his.

1 Peter 1:3 proclaims, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

A living hope? It is living because Christ is alive, and he dwells in each of us who have received him as Lord and Savior. Life is so much simpler with Jesus. We learn to love as he loved. By doing so "he makes us whole by making us holy and he makes us holy by making us whole."

What an utter relief it is to know that you can stop struggling to be free from sin, because Jesus has already done it. Seek instead to walk on the journey of holiness, with Christ your life living in you and living through you.




