

Welcome to Advent, one of my most favorite times of the year. It is also one of the craziest because of how busy it is and how much is packed into the weeks preceding Christmas. But I like it for a reason most probably do not appreciate, which is the message of Advent. The word “Advent” comes from a Latin word meaning “arrival” or “coming.”

It marks the beginning of the Christian year, announcing the coming of the King of Kings and Prince of Peace. It is both a joy-filled time of celebration of the anticipation of the arrival of our Savior as an infant child, and also a time of spiritual preparation involving repentance, meditation and penance. You wouldn't be able to discern this from the observances in which most of us engage; a season of parties, Christmas cookies, family gatherings, holiday cheer, and gifts. Oh, and don't forget the music, got to have the music. I must admit I do enjoy the popular Christmas songs, but they would not hold any joy for me without the power and significance found in many of our Christmas hymns.

Some time ago, I read an Advent devotional called, “The Gospel of Advent.” The title may sound a bit strange since when we think of the Gospel, we think of Easter, the cross and being set free from sin, but really the Good News of Jesus Christ is much bigger than that. It starts with God deciding to become like us, to do life with us, to teach us face to face what God is like, establishing the kingdom of heaven on earth, setting us free from sin and death through his sacrifice on the cross, and sealing it with his resurrection from the grave. Yet all this started in a manger so long ago.

It was something so worth singing about that the heavenly host could not keep it in. They had to proclaim it and proclaim it they did. Their song opened the barrier between heaven and earth and the shepherds were witness to it.

Charles Wesley wrote about it when he penned his timeless hymn, “Hark! the Herald Angels Sing.” As you read it, see if you can sense the wonder of the gospel message that the angels proclaimed.

Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King!"
peace on earth, and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled!
Joyful, all ye nations rise, join the triumph of the skies;
with th' angelic host proclaim, "Christ is born in Bethlehem!"
Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King!"

Christ, by highest heaven adored; Christ the everlasting Lord;
late in time behold him come, offspring a virgin's womb.
Veiled in flesh the Godhead see; hail th' incarnate Deity,
pleased with us in flesh to dwell, Jesus, our Emmanuel.
Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King!"

Hail the heaven-born Prince of Peace! Hail the Sun of Righteousness!
Light and life to all he brings, risen with healing in his wings.
Mild he lays his glory by, born that we no more may die,
born to raise us from the earth, born to give us second birth.
Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King!"

The line in the final verse, "born that we no more may die," connects together everything God has been doing throughout all of human history. He lays his glory by so that he might impart his life to us, an eternal life that was lost because of sin. If you have opened up your life to Jesus Christ and allowed room in your heart and mind for him, then the life of Christ is in you. This is why Advent is so powerful for me; the message is so profound and incredible that no earthly celebration can do it justice.


