Have you ever been in a gathering where someone passes around a box of chocolates, but by the time you get to it, there isn't much from which to choose; others have chosen their favorites and what is left are the less desirable ones? In John 15:16 Jesus tells his disciples "You did not choose me but I chose you." What was so special and desirable about the disciples that Jesus would choose them over anyone else? We do not know, but maybe it was they had a desire for something more, or a longing for God, or to belong. Maybe he chose them because in some way, each of them was lost in the darkness of this world. But weren't we all?

If you have been watching the TV series, The Chosen, you will notice that the people who end up following Jesus are a lot like us. Each had varying degrees of faith and commitment to God and yet, each of them was caught up or you could say lost, in their own understanding of faith and how to live it. This I think is the genius of The Chosen series. It creates characters with a depth of life, so that you can read the scriptures and understand why the biblical characters behave in the way they do.

You can then begin to examine how you live and respond to life's circumstances in the way you do. This examination is a critical part of being a follower Jesus Christ and it is why Jesus has chosen you. He has chosen you for a purpose, a holy and sacred purpose. In 1 Peter 2:9–10, Peter makes this bold proclamation:

But you re a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Paul writes this in Colossians 1:13–14, see if you notice any similarities.

He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Did you notice that in each verse, the idea of being called out or transferred? In both verses it tells us that we dwelt in darkness, and we were under its power and influence. But by the redeeming actions of Jesus Christ, we were rescued and experienced the mercy of God.

In 1 Peter 2:4–5, Peter plainly gives us this instruction, so that we don't fall back into the darkness from which we were rescued.

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

The invitation here is to come to Jesus, not just once and confess belief in him, but to come to him and stay with him, following him, learning, and fitting our lives to be like his. It involves walking in his light, choosing the way of his kingdom, and giving him authority over everything in your life. One of the key words here is "let." Peter tells us that each of us must let ourselves be built into a spiritual house. Meaning, the work in you is not finished, there is more to do.

Each of us are called to let a desire to grow into a spiritual house, a dwelling place for Christ to grow in us, all in response to his great love that was poured out upon us. This means letting the Holy Spirit work in us to grow us into persons who no longer follow the ways of the darkness from which we have been rescued. Can you identify those ways that continue to reign in you? Are you willing to let the Holy Spirit guide you and move you deeper into the wonderful light?

You have been chosen for this. Through Christ you have been transferred, and rescued from that which would consume you and swallow up your life in darkness and sin. Just as Jesus himself has chosen you, continue daily to choose him in all things. 
