

Wilt previously served St. Paul's UMC in Lewisburg and has graciously agreed to be our new DS.

Hello friends in the Williamsport District and beyond,

This has been a big year in our connection. We had a General Conference almost three months ago, an Annual Conference over a month ago, and a Jurisdictional Conference just a few weeks ago. The College of Bishops for the Northeast Jurisdiction put out a letter after the General Conference stating that we are "moving forward as a church that embraces theological diversity." While there is beauty in that theological diversity, it does not come easily. Learning to do life together can be challenging at times, and we've experienced that a lot over the last few years.

In February 2019, there was a special General Conference to discuss the denomination's stance on human sexuality, and at that gathering, the language of incompatibility was upheld. For those wanting a more inclusive church, there was pain, and some asked, "Is the United Methodist Church a place for me?" Some pastors left, some churches were divided, and we were in the newspapers for better or worse. Some people asked for space and time to gather and process with likeminded individuals. While that was happening, some also found comfort that the language was upheld.

In May 2024, the denomination met once again, and the restrictive language around human sexuality was removed. It allowed local areas to determine for themselves how they would navigate human sexuality. Churches and pastors were given space to pray and discern how they would live into their theological understanding in the context they serve. The bishops and cabinet are to help create space for this theological diversity.

Some celebrate what was done. Some may disagree with the decisions but are grateful that they can determine things for themselves and that space for them will be given. Some are now wrestling with whether there is a place for them in the United Methodist Church.

Romans 12:15 says, "Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep."

For those of you rejoicing, we find space to rejoice with you! Through prayer and study, you have come to a theological understanding, and for the first time in our denomination's history, you have space to live into that understanding. If I can do anything to walk alongside you and to create space for you to process what this moment of celebration can be, please know I am here for you and rejoice with you in this season! You are not alone, and there is space for you to celebrate.

For those who are wrestling, you are seen and heard. You waited to see what would happen at General Conference, and with the removal of the language and the removal of disaffiliation, you feel betrayed, lied to, cast aside, and are asking is there space for you here. While I can share that people were operating out of their best understanding and that our Annual Conference sent a petition to the General Conference to allow for an exit plan to continue, that doesn't remove the sting at this time. While I can say boldly and confidently there is space for you in this place, I know many aren't able to hear those words right now. My heart breaks to see the pain that is being felt in our churches. If there is anything I can do to walk with you in this wrestling and weeping, please let me know. If you need space to gather, time with others to pray, or anything else I can offer, please know I am here to make sure there is space for you. You are not alone and those who wept in 2019 know all too well the space that is needed to process this.

Following the way of Christ is simply stated but difficult to live out. There was rejoicing and weeping in 2019 and now some who were weeping have found their joy and some who had comfort find themselves hurting now. May we remember one another in this season. Check in on one another and help to ensure that people feel they have a place here.

Friends, I have been praying every day for you all. As a conference, and especially in our district, my hope is that we are here for one another. As we close out our first month in this appointment as a district and superintendent, I am grateful for the worship, the VBSs, the ministries, the meetings, and the ways you continue to navigate how to bring the healing and wholeness of Jesus to a hurting world. As we continue into a tumultuous period in our country and world, may we model to those around us how we can hold different views on very important things and still care for one another in powerful ways.

Whether you are a lay person or clergy person, however I can be helpful, please reach out, even if it is just to sit with you in total silence. God told us the first thing that was not good was for us to be alone (Genesis 2:18). So, if you are weeping or if you are rejoicing, don't do it alone.
